Subject: – "Meri Mati Mera Desh" 2023

Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) stands as a momentous nationwide initiative, managed by the collective efforts of our citizens, to commemorate 75 years of India's independence. In line with this monumental occasion, the Ministry of Culture has conceived a campaign named "Meri Mati Mera Desh," set to serve as the culmination of the Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav. This campaign will be a tribute to the valorous Veers who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country. It will encompass ceremonies conducted at the block, urban local body, state, and national levels, with the active participation of educational institutions at all tiers, including schools.

To ensure the resounding success of this initiative, schools play a vital role. CBSE urges all schools to engage in the following key areas:

- Igniting Enthusiasm through Student Involvement:
- Foster a sense of participation by involving students actively in the campaign.
- Devote special assemblies to the campaign's theme and distribute informative leaflets to parents, creating awareness and garnering support for the cause.
- Encourage students to take the Panch Pran Pledge, a solemn commitment to the nation's values. Additionally, encourage them to take selfies with handfuls of soil ("Mitti") and upload them to the dedicated website, symbolizing their connection to the land and its history.
- Ensure that students actively engage in the campaign at the grassroots, block, urban local body, and national levels.

Details of the comprehensive program outlined by the Ministry of Culture in their letter dated 23.07.2023 are attached in Annexure-1.

Furthermore, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports is spearheading a significant aspect of the celebration—a plantation drive. In commemoration of 75 years of independence, schools are encouraged to plant 75 saplings of indigenous trees and establish an "Amrit Vatika" on their premises. Communication from the Ministry of Youth Affaires is enclosed as Annexure-2

In support of this endeavor, the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change is providing saplings for the plantation. The Director General of Forest and Special Secretary has communicated with the Principal Chief Conservators of Forest and Heads of Forest Forces of all States/Union Territories, seeking their involvement. By encouraging student participation in these activities, schools can collectively honor our heritage, amplify our dedication to the nation, and lay the foundation for a brighter, greener future.

Deo. Sonjay:

Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) being celebrated as a nationwide and people led initiative commemorate 75 years of India's independence and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements.

- 2. 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' started on 12th March 2021 with a march from Sabarmati to Dandi. In this over two years journey, AKAM programmes have witnessed massive Janbhagidhari. Till the end of June 2023, more than 1.9 lakh events were undertaken. As on date, 9 AKAM related programmes are done every hour. This is the largest celebratory effort in the post-Independence history of India dedicated to 75 years of freedom.
- 3. "Meri Maati Mera Desh" campaign is envisaged as a culminating event of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. It involves paying tribute to the 'Veers', who have made the supreme sacrifice for the country, by conducting ceremonies at Panchayat/Village, Block, Urban Local body, State & National level.
- 4. The details of the programmes under the campaign "Meri Maati Mera Desh" to be organized in the Rural and Urban Areas are as given below:
 - A. Programs in Rural Areas: There are three key stages to the programme in the rural areas- Panchayat/Village level programme, Block level Programme, and the Finale at the National Capital.

i. Panchayat level programs: - These programmes are to be organized between 9th August 2023 to 15th August 2023. There are five elements of the Panchayat level programmes as detailed below:

a. Dedication of Shilaphalakam (memorial): A fundamental aspect of the program is to express heartfelt gratitude to all the brave hearts (Veer) who have made the supreme sacrifice. On the Shilaphalakam, names of the Veers are to be inscribed. For this purpose, the Veers includes freedom fighters, defense personnel, personnel of Central Armed Police Forces and State Police who laid down their lives in the line of duty. Shilaphalakam may preferably be erected near Amrit Sarovars or in the absence of Amrit Sarovar, some other appropriate water body. In case no such water body is available, the Shilaphalakam may be constructed in the Panchayat building or local school or at some other prominent location. (The design of the Shilaphalakam is enclosed in the Annexure). Events may be held at panchayat/Village from 9th August 2023 to 15th August 2023, near Shilaphalakam.

b. Panch Pran Pledge: At the memorial site, people will take a solemn pledge covering Panch Pran of the Hon'ble Prime Minister, affirming their commitment to the country. The pledge is given below:

"I pledge to play my part in building a developed India

I pledge to remove any trace of colonial mindset

I pledge to take pride in promotion & preservation our rich cultural heritage I pledge to strive for the unity and solidarity of the country

I pledge to fulfill my duties and responsibilities towards my nation

I pledge to honour the sacrifice of our country's brave-hearts and devote myself to nation's defense & progress"

During the ceremony, people would either individually or collectively take a selfie while taking the pledge with soil in the hand and upload to the dedicated website. This would be a key public activation activity to ensure

high janbhagidari.

 Vasudha Vandhan: Each Gram Panchayat/village will renew and replenish Mother Earth by planting 75 saplings of indigenous species and

developing an Amrit Vatika.

d. Veeron Ka Vandan: Panchayats may hold felicitation ceremonies for honoring thefreedom fighters and the families of the deceased freedom fighters. They may also honour retired personnel from Defense, CAPF and State Police and the families of the brave hearts of these forces who have sacrificed their lives in the line of duty. Felicitation may be as per local traditions and customs.

e. Hoisting of the National Flag and singing of Rashtragaan may be

undertaken at each of the programme sites

- Block Level Programs: Youth volunteers and other people would collect Mitti from each Panchayat/Village and bring them to the block level. From each Block, Mitti Kalash having the soil from all thePanchayat/Village, would be carried to the National Capital. For better youth participation at Gram Panchayat/Village and Block level, the District Youth Officer of NYKS, Department of Youth Affairs may be associated with the campaign.
- iii. Finale Event at New Delhi: From 27th August 2023 to 30th August 2023, the collected Mitti-Kalash will be transported to Kartavya Path, New Delhi. The Mitti from all parts of the country would be utilized to develop a unique garden, called Amrit Vatika, with plantation of the indigenous species. An AKAM Memorial dedicated to all the heroes who have contributed for the freedom, unity and integrity of the country would be erected.
- Programs in Urban Areas: There are three key stages to the programme in the Urban areas. The first level of programmes will be held in the small Urban Local bodies, Notified Area Councils (NACs), Cantonment Boards, Town Panchayats. Second level programmes will be at bigger Municipalities and Municipal Corporations and the third level, i.e. the finale will be at the National Capital.

Programmes in Small Urban bodies/NAC/Cantonment Boards/Town Panchayats: These programmes are to be between 9th August 2023 to 15th August 2023. In these areas all the five elements detailed for the rural areas in para 4 (A)(i) may be conducted.

Programmes at the larger Municipalities/Corporations: These programmes are to beorganized between 16th August 2023 to 20th August, 2023. The Mitti Kalash are to be brought ceremoniously to larger

Municipalities/Corporations.

Finale Event at New Delhi: From 27th August 2023 to 30th August 2023, iii the collected Mitti-Kalash from the Municipalities will be transported to Kartavya Path, New Delhi.

Program at the State Capital: State Governments may like to organize State level ceremonial programmes dedicated to Meri Maati Mera Desh Campaign. These programmes may be held between 16th August to 25th August 2023.

Dear Sanjay ji

In order to commemorate 75 years of Independence, a Mega program Meri Mati Mera Desh is proposed to be conducted on $9^{\rm th}$ August, 2023 in over 2.5 lakhs+ Gram Panchayats across the nation.

- 2. A key component of the program is planting of 75 saplings of indigenous trees and establish Amrit Vatika at village level. This act would re-affirm our bond with the land and renews our commitment to protect it for future generations. The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has kindly agreed to offer support by providing saplings for the plantation. In this regards, DG Forest and Special Secretary Ministry of Environment and forest have written letter to Principal Chief Conservator of Forest to extend their support. A copy of the letter is attached here.
- 3. The Amrit Vatika should ideally be located near an Amrit Sarovar or water body; where these are unavailable, Village Schools would be excellent locations for the establishment of Amrit Vatika. If feasible, all schools can plant Amrit Vatikas of 75 saplings per school. Accordingly, we request the Department of School Education and literacy to write to School Education Department of States/UTs to identify location for establishment of Amrit Vatika and extend their support for making this Mega programme a success.
- 4. Directions are being issued to the field level officers of NYKS/ NSS to liaise with the respective forest departments in States/Union Territories in this regard. We look forward to hearing from you at the earliest.


